

## **2016 CPRA RULE CHANGES**

### **Section XI.A.3 (d) – NEW**

There is no minimum requirement for number of rodeos to qualify for the CFR in the Novice events (NBB, NSB) or steer riding (SR).

### **Section VII.F.10 – NEW**

When using the two (2) judge system, judges will judge from the back of the chutes, in the bull riding (one judge per side).

### **Section VI.B.9 – REVISED**

Each stock contractor shall be required to supply sufficient and adequate livestock, both in quantity and quality, to put on a proper and acceptable rodeo, having regard to the expected number of entries, and should a stock contractor fail to do so he shall be subject to fine, suspension, or other disciplinary action by the association. The number of timed event cattle to produce a one head Association approved rodeo will be **no more, no less than** half enough plus two (2) **or one for everyone plus two (2)**. E.g.: If there are fifty (50) contestants entered in a timed event the required number of cattle would be twenty seven (27). Minimum number of cattle required for rodeos that have two (2) go-rounds in the tie-down roping, steer wrestling, and team roping shall be ½ the number of entries. Failure to comply will result in a five hundred (\$500) dollar fine for each rodeo. If available, Mexican type cattle are to be used in the steer wrestling event (~~refer to rule E, 14, c~~).

### **Section VIII.D.10 – REVISED**

Rodeo committees have the option of supplying 1/3 (+~~4~~**2** spares) the amount of cattle as contestants, up to, and including the May long weekend. After the May long weekend they must use ~~at least~~ **no more, no less than** ½ enough **plus two (2) or one for everyone plus two (2)**.
