Section V A. 3. a. A ~~single priority list~~ **separate priority list** shall be drawn for all performance preference rodeos having the same entry closing date. At CPRA rodeos that overlap, whether or not the entry closing dates are the same, preference in drawing the priority list shall be given to contestants who have entered the most rodeos, provided the contestant is entered in a common event at all locations, with contestants who have entered only one of several overlapping rodeos to receive the lowest priority. In the timed events the performances will be filled from the bottom, except ladies barrel racing which will be filled from the top down.

Section V B. Entries and Drawing 1. c.

Local Entries

Local contestants shall be entitled to enter one rodeo without first buying a CPRA card. All roughstock contestants must be approved by the event representative for the event in question to finalizing draw.

Local entry must enter rodeo before entries close.

No priority will be given, and contestant will only be entered if rodeo does not meet its qualifications.

If local entry is excepted they will have to pay entry fees plus all CRES and insurance costs one week prior to the first performance or slack of the rodeo.

If fees are not paid at this time contestant will be drawn out of rodeo.

Local entry contestant will have until the end of the first business day following rodeo to buy a CPRA card for money to count towards standings. All rules and regulations that apply to membership qualifications will apply.

Rodeo committee must specify on approval if they will be accepting local entries

Rodeo committee must accept all cards (permits) in order to accept local entries

If local entry is eligible to purchase a semi pro or regular card in the Association they will not be eligible to enter as a local

C. 1. a. If a contestant qualifies for the finals of a Pro rodeo, and that contestant is scheduled to compete on the same day in another rodeo, with added purse money of \$3,000 or more in the event that contestant entered (the conflicting rodeo), only the conflicted contestant will be moved forward at the conflicting Pro rodeo to the first available position ~~in the event they made the finals for~~, where possible. The contestant must notify the Central Rodeo Entry Office or the arena secretary at the conflicting rodeo of the conflict no later than the turn-out deadline for his originally scheduled

performance at the conflicting rodeo. If there are no available positions, the contestant will not be moved.

- i. If a riding event contestant qualifies for a finals and has a conflict with another rodeo with added purse money of \$3,000 or more in the event that contestant entered, and his originally drawn animal cannot be made available at the conflicting rodeo, that contestant can either accept the designated re-ride for the next available performance or, if prior to the end of the first go-round of the conflicting rodeo, elect to be drawn out of the conflicting rodeo.

- A. 2. Nominations of stock for CFR are to be received by the Association office ~~by August 15,~~ **no later than 4pm MST on the last business day in August.** Stock selection, received no later than forty-eight (48) hours after the last performance of the final regular season rodeo, and injury substitutions are to be made ~~by October 15~~ **one (1) week prior to CFR** of the given year.

~~8. a. i. In the Tie Down Roping~~ Committees have the option of supplying 1/3 (2 spares) the amount of cattle as contestants, up to, and including the May long weekend. After the May long weekend they must use no more, no less than 1/2 enough plus two (2) or one for everyone plus two (2).

e. If the barrier **or** neck rope flies up and hits the contestant or his rope, impairing him, the contestant may declare himself, and if so, may be given a re-run. Contestant ~~shall so~~ **must** declare himself **by not continuing with the run including** not throwing his rope or by not attempting to get down on the steer.

6. d. If a calf **animal** is jerked down, **by the first jerk of the rope**, the contestant will be disqualified. Jerk down is defined as calf **animal** is jerked over backwards between ten (10) and two (2) on a standard clock or between thirty (30) and one hundred and fifty (150) degrees with the animal landing on his back or head with all four feet in the air.

All steer wrestling cattle used ~~at more than one rodeo~~ must be number branded on the left side and be approved by the steer wrestling representative thirty (30) days before the first rodeo the steers in question are to be used. Failure to do so will result in a ~~two hundred dollar (\$200) fine, escalating one hundred dollars (\$100) a week to a maximum of five hundred dollars (\$500).~~ **a fine of five hundred dollars (\$500) per head.** If contractor does not comply at the first rodeo, the fine structure will remain in place at each following rodeo ~~until suitable steers are approved.~~

~~Whereas the Association ratified an agreement with Northlands Park in November of 2004 providing for the staging of a Canadian Finals Rodeo (CFR), annually at which the Canadian championships will be determined in those events held at the CFR.~~

3. Each Canadian stock contractor will nominate up to three (3) animals, and the nominations must be received in the Association office ~~before September 1st of each year.~~ **no later than 4pm MST on the last business day in August.** A ballot will be mailed to the top fifteen (15) contestants in the standings following the September Labour Day weekend of each year. Each member receiving a ballot may make their first, second, and third choice. Points will be awarded to the animal based on three (3) points for first, two (2) points for second and one (1) point for third. The animal receiving the most points will be declared animal of the year. In case of a tie, the animal receiving the most first place votes would be declared the winner. If necessary, second and third place votes would be used to break the tie.
